Basic conversations in Korean

This is based on 'Expression'. Not 'a literal translation'

Situation 1. With Brian.

▶ Let's watch a video about '안녕하세요(An-nyeong-ha-se-yeo)'

A: 안녕하세요. 사장님~

A: An-nyeong-ha-se-yeo. Sa-jang-nim~

A: Hi, Brian.

• 사장님(sa-jang-nim) = CEO/President Korean don't usually say name. We call the position name of job Such as 사장님(sa-jang-nim; CEO/President), 선생님(sun-sang-nim; Teacher),교수님(gyo-su-nim; professor) else.

B : 어, 000 왔어? B : Uh, Wa-sseo? B : Uh, 000!

A: 안녕히 계셨어요?

A : An-nyeong-e Gea-syeo-sseo-yeo? A : How are you? (Were you being well?)

• 약성 (An-nyeong) = Hi, Hello.

This is formal way for older. 'How are you' has 'say hi' feeling. We really use 'Hi'word for 'How are you?' sentence.

B: 응, 그래. 여기 앉아.

B: Yeong, Geu-re. Yeo-gi-an-ja.

B: Yeah, good. You can sit down here.

A : 한국말 공부 좀 했어?

A: Han-gook-mal gong-bu jom hea-sseo?

A: Did you study Korean?

B : 네, 한국말 공부 조금 했어요.

B : Ne, Han-gook-mal gong-bu jo-geum he-sseo-yeo.

B: Yes, I studied Korean a little bit.

- 좀(jom), 조금(jo-geum) = a little, a little bit
- 좀(jom) is a shorter version of 조금(jo-geum).

A: 그래, 잘했어~ 뭐 공부했어?

A : Geu-rea, jal-hea-sseo~ Mo gong-bu-hea-sseo?

A : Good job~ What did you study?

B:000 공부 했어요.

B: 000 Gong-bu hea-sseo-yeo.

B: I studied 000.

- Sseo past sentence.
- Hea-sseo = Did

▶ Let's watch a video about 진짜(jin-jja)

A: 이거, 먹어봐.

A: Yi-geo, meo-geo-bwa.

A: Try this.

B: 아, 감사합니다~ 잘 먹겠습니다.

B : Ah, gam-sa-ham-ni-da~ jal-muk-get-sseum-ni-da.

B: Ah, Thank you~ I will eat well.

• 잘 먹겠습니다(jal-muk-get-sseum-ni-da) = I will eat well. Korean say 'Thanks' before eating food.

A : 어때?

A: uh-ddea?

A: What do you think?

B: 이거 진짜 맛있어요!

B: Yi-geo jin-jja ma-si-sseo-yeo!

B: This is really delicious!

A: 진짜? A: jin-jja? A: really?

B : 네, 진짜요~

B: Ne, jin-jja-yeo~

B: Yop, really~

A : 좋아, 좋아.

A: Jo-a, jo-a. A: good, good.

B: 잘 먹었습니다~

B: Jal meo-geot-sseum-ni-da.

Before eating	After eating
잘 먹겠습니다.	잘 먹었습니다.
(Jal-muk-get-sseum-ni-da.)	(Jal-meo-geot-sseum-ni-da.)
I will eat well.	I ate well.

B: 사장님, 저 들어가 볼께요. 안녕히 계세요~

B: Sa-jang-nim, jeo deu-reo-ga bol-ggea-yeo. An-nyeong-hi gea-se-yeo~

B: Brian, I'm leaving. Bye~

A: 어, 그래. 잘가~ 또 보자

A: Uh, geu-rea. Jal-ga~ ddo-bo-ja. A: Uh, Okay, Bye~ See you soon.

When you leave	When somebody leave (and you stay)
안녕히 계세요.	안녕히 가세요.
(An-nyeong-hi gea-se-yeo .)	(An-nyeong-hi ga-se-yeo .)
Bye.(I'm leaving)	Bye
